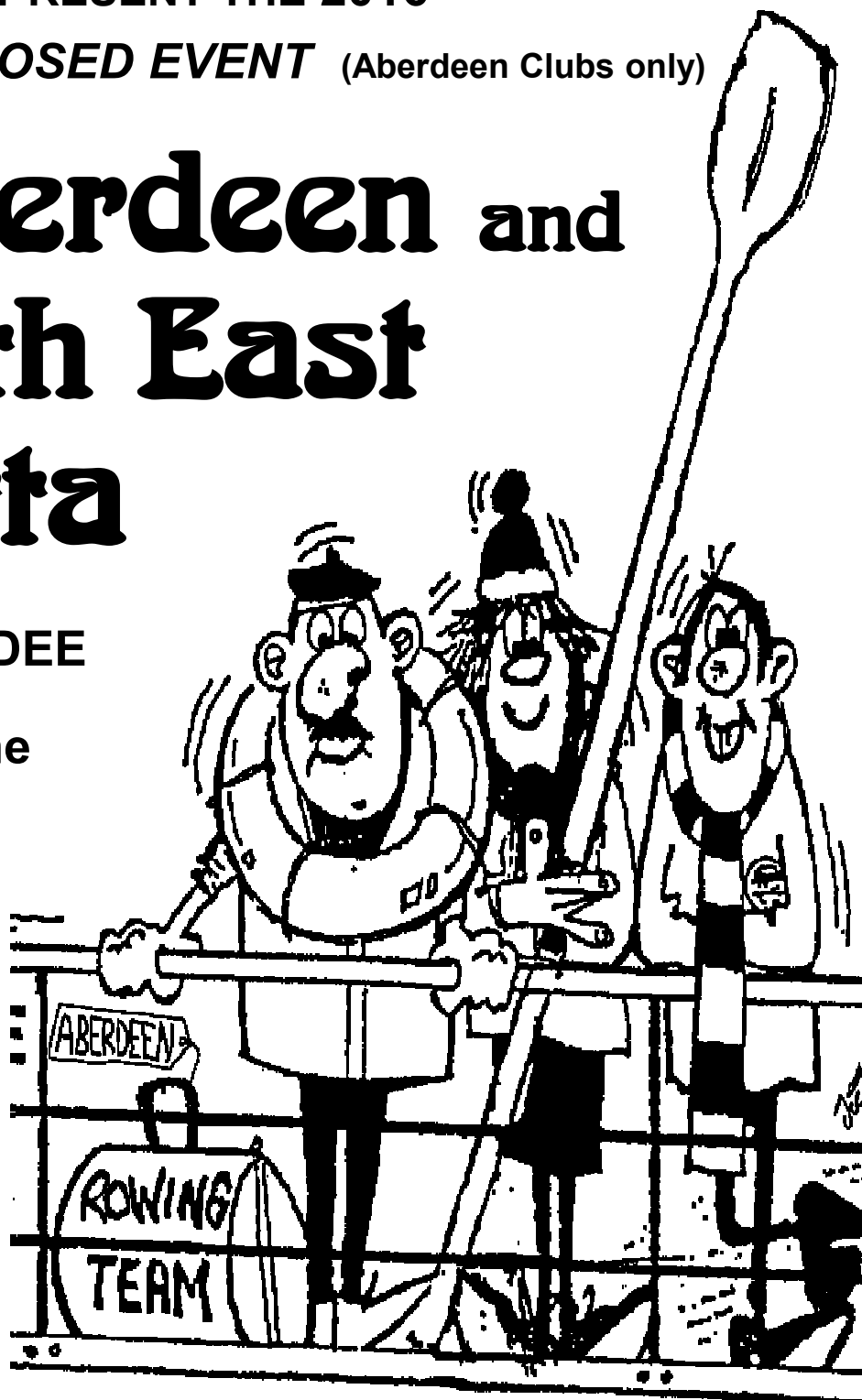

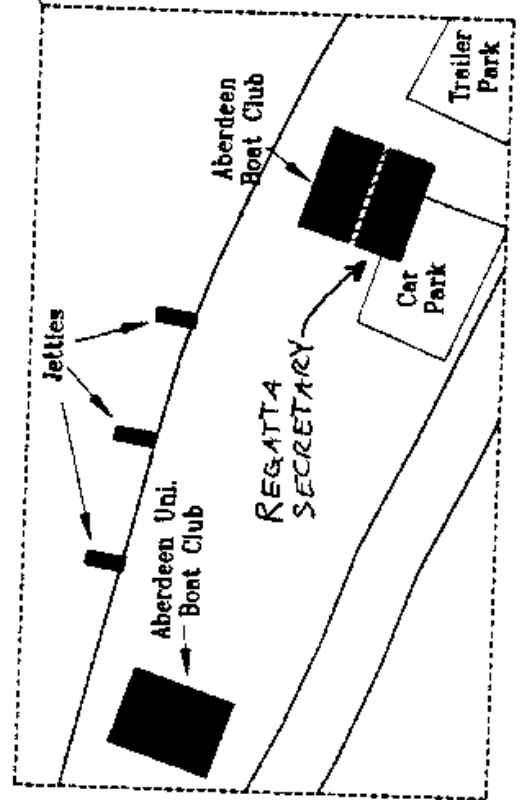
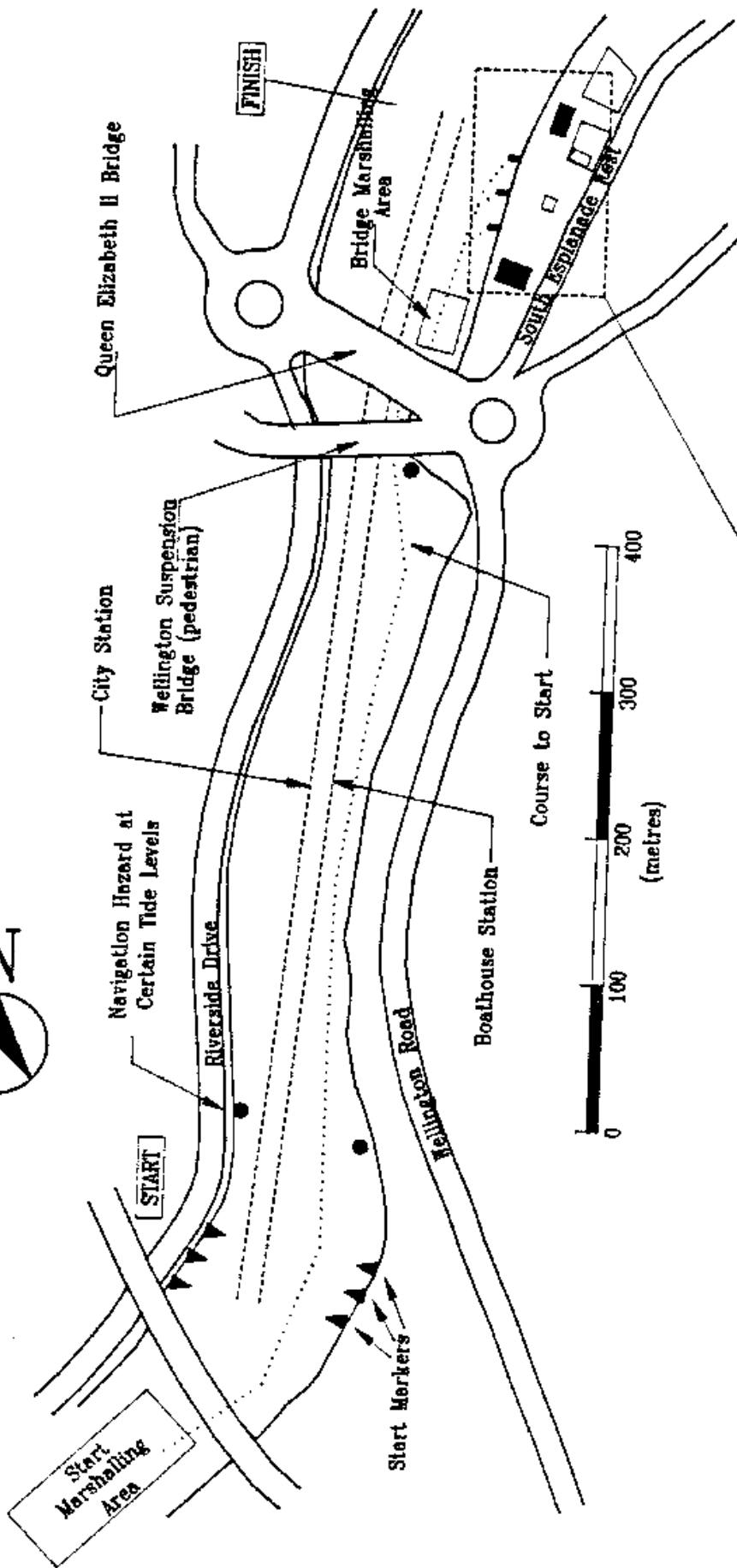

Local Regatta Rules

(Please also study the course map and its Notes)

- The rules of racing of *Scottish Rowing* apply to this regatta.
- Club Captains, or their representatives, must report to the Regatta Secretary before the start of the regatta. **Any crew which fails to submit a written list of crew members or has not paid its entry fee by the time of its first race will be disqualified.** (see Scottish Rowing rule B3)
- Bow-slot numbers will be loaned to competitors upon deposit of £5 and these must be in place while racing. The deposit will be refunded on safe return of the number.
- Competitors must report to the start marshal **at least five minutes before their published race times. Crews must then stay in touch with the start marshal until they are called to the start line.** Due to a lot of doubling-up, the timing of the regatta is critical and late crews will be disqualified (Aberdeen crews take note !)
- The first named crew will take the City Station (opposite the Boathouse), the second named crew will take the Boathouse Station.
- The 700m course will be used in all events. The course is in two lanes and runs downstream from a free start below the Railway Bridge. It runs through the two bridges with a slight bend before the finish at the upstream end of the Aberdeen Boat Club Boathouse. There are three buoys near the finish and **boats and blades must pass between the appropriate buoys, or risk disqualification.**
- The buoys near the finish do **not** represent the exact finish line and crews should not stop racing until instructed by the umpire.
- We do not have permission to row below the Victoria Bridge (downstream of the Boathouse). Any crew violating this rule is likely to be sunk and/or disqualified.
- The Championship of the Dee for the Wood Group Trophy will be decided over the two days of competition on a points system. Points will be awarded to Clubs whose members take part in a final of each event. Losing finalists will receive one point per crew member (including coxes) and winning finalists two points.
- We regret that due to the loss of various irreplaceable trophies over the years that we cannot allow trophies to leave the control of the organising committee.



Course Details

- Crews must boat facing upstream and proceed to the bridge marshalling area. Please be careful going under the Suspension Bridge as the river is narrow here and you must watch out for crews racing downstream and **give way to them if necessary**.
- Crews must keep to the Boathouse side of the river on the way up to the start.
- Crews may be asked to turn **downstream** of the Railway Bridge if the tide is low, but normally they should report to the start marshal **above** the railway bridge.
- The start is free and, in view of the downstream current, manoeuvring at the start should normally be done by backing down.
- There is a line of buoys near the finish but these do not represent the exact finish line and crews should not stop racing until instructed by the finisher. Boats and blades must pass within the correct line of buoys.
- After finishing, all crews should turn and approach a jetty as soon as possible especially if their boat or members are required for other events
- Prizegiving will take place approximately 15 minutes after the last race of each day

***new* Notes For Veteran Events**

A handicap system will operate in all veteran events. Veteran crews must declare their status **in writing** to the secretary at least 30 minutes before their first race., otherwise they will be assumed to be Veteran A (no advantage).

The following table gives an **indication** of advantages for our 720m course. These may vary depending on conditions on the day (they are based on the standard time for a Vet A FISA World Masters crew in each category). ***It is based on the new tables produced by Dan Davidson in May 2016 and due to be adopted by Scottish Rowing.***

NB HANDICAPPING WILL TAKE PLACE AT THE FINISH

Crews will start level, as usual, and the time differential between the first and second crews will be measured as they cross the finish line. If this time is less than the previously intimated handicap, then the crew which was second over the line will be deemed to have won the race.

In accordance with Recommendations from *Scottish Rowing* we will allow a **maximum separation of three handicap divisions** (eg A to C or D to F). If the separation is greater than this, then the older crew will be offered a lower (younger) classification or the option to withdraw. eg if a vet A crew and a vet E crew are the only entrants, the vet E crew can only be offered a 'C' handicap advantage.

North East Regatta 2015

16th & 17th May 2015

Notes from last year's event

For the first time in living memory, the North East Regatta this year was run as a *closed* event. This means that it did not feature on the Scottish Rowing (SR) list of regattas and entries could only be accepted from a maximum of four clubs (ABC, ASRA, AUBC and RGUBC). It also meant that results were not qualifying and winners did not change their Novice status or accrue winning points on their SR licences. It made it cheaper for us to run as we did not have to pay the regatta levy fee (typically about £250) to SR after the event.

Amongst the downsides of a closed event were that we had to find our own umpires (normally they are provided by SR) and that entries could not be accepted from clubs from outside Aberdeen. The Committee of the Dee will be reviewing the pros and cons of this experiment prior to making a decision about the 2016 event.

This year saw a rather better entry than in 2014 and racing conditions were benign on both days with dull weather which lacked any sparkle but was also free from adverse racing conditions. Races started and finished on time and no racing incidents were reported to me.

The Championship of the Dee went to ASRA who led the points-table on both days. Due to the closed nature of this regatta, we excluded Junior and Veteran events from the Championship points since these could only be won by ASRA and ABC respectively.

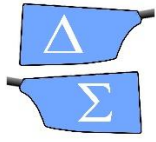

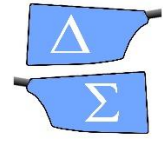


Two races will be held during this year's NER at 12:55 and

50th Anniversary of The Deeside Sculler Club



The Deeside Scullers club (often abbreviated to its initials of 'Delta Sigma' ($\Delta\Sigma$) in the Greek Alphabet) was formed in 1966 as a break-away group from Aberdeen University Boat Club (AUBC).

At that time, AUBC was the major rowing club in Aberdeen and all competitive rowing took place out of the AUBC boathouse. The site of the current ABC boathouse was occupied by Ogilvie's Boatyard, a business that rented leisure craft (rowing boats, kayaks or small motor launches) to citizens of Aberdeen to allow them to mess about on the river. The 'RGIT Boathouse' (current RGU Boathouse) housed dinghies and some sailing craft but no racing rowing boats. Both the Robert Gordon Rowing Club and its university status were not even twinkles in the eye of the College of Further Education which was RGIT!

Extract from original minutes

Deeside Scullers Club was founded at a meeting of Messrs RFI Moore, B Smith, MJ Webster and RG Livingston in the Dungeon, University Union, Broad Street, Aberdeen on Wednesday 30th May 1966 at 5pm.

The objects of the select club of experienced oarsmen are broadly to facilitate communication between members and Aberdeen University Boat Club and to provide a club and colours under which any member may, at any time or place, row or scull. Membership is by invitation and confined to those who have connections with Aberdeen University Boat Club.

What has Delta Sigma ever done for me ... ?

I have heard this asked by various members of AUBC over the years. As well as living-up to its declared intent of maintaining communication between current university rowers and 'old boys' (or gals), $\Delta\Sigma$ has provided tangible support in the past including sponsorship of try-rowing events (free food and beer!) and the purchase of the Janousek 4+ 'The Δ eelinquent Σ tudent' which was gifted to the club entirely using funds from $\Delta\Sigma$ or $\Delta\Sigma$ members.

But I'm a member of RGUBC ...

I hope the above precis helps explain that DS does not ignore RGUBC but the reason for non-inclusion in stated aims is simply that RGU did not exist at the formation of $\Delta\Sigma$!

$\Delta\Sigma$ is aware that the Aberdeen universities (pleural) are increasingly working as one unit and is exploring ways of supporting this combined group. A major current project is exploring the purchase of a rowing trailer since neither university owns one.
